

Michelle A. Patriquin, PhD Director of Research Senior Psychologist, The Menninger Clinic Inventing an Intuitive Software System for Clinical Use of Wearables Data in Inpatient Psychiatry

Dr. Michelle Patriquin is the Director of Research and a Senior Psychologist at The Menninger Clinic and Associate Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, Texas. She is board certified by the American Board of Professional Psychology (ABPP) and is a licensed psychologist. The Menninger Clinic is an inpatient and outpatient psychiatric hospital that has been a nationally ranked in the top 10 by US News for over 30 years. She has authored over 185 publications and presentations on her research, which has examined the subjective and objective precursors of mental illness including sleep problems, anxiety, depression, and suicide. Her work is funded by federal and foundation grants. She has been honored with multiple awards for her research and mentorship, including the New Investigator Award by the American Society of Clinical Psychopharmacology and the Rising Star Award by the Association for Psychological Science. She is has served as a standing reviewer for over 4 years on a NIH SBIR/STTR panel reviewing grants at the intersection of novel technology (apps, Al, sensors) and psychiatry/biobehavioral areas. At The Menninger Clinic, she leads a large, diverse team of faculty and staff to better understand mental health diagnoses and outcomes for intensive psychiatric treatment settings. Across her clinical work and research, she is committed to increasing evidence-based practice - particularly by designing and leveraging new technology – within intensive mental health treatment settings.
